A **relative pronoun** connects a phrase or a clause to a noun or pronoun. Think of them as linking words. They introduce a **relative clause**, which provides more information about the noun. The most common relative pronouns are **who**, **whom**, **whose**, **which**, and **that**.

- **Who** and **whom** are used for people.
- **Whose** shows possession (ownership) for people or things.
- **Which** and **that** are used for things, places, or animals.

Remember:

- Use **who** when the pronoun is the **subject** of the clause (performing the action).
- Use **whom** when the pronoun is the **object** of the verb or a preposition (receiving the action).

Comparison of adjectives is how we change the form of an adjective to show a difference in degree between things. We use three forms:

- **Positive: The basic form of the adjective (e.g., *tall, smart*).**
- **Comparative: Used to compare two things. We often add -er or use more (e.g., *taller, more beautiful*).**
- **Superlative: Used to compare three or more things. We often add -est or use most (e.g., *tallest, most beautiful*).**
