Disadvantages: a) undemocratic: sometimes the two party system is considered undemocratic as the ideological choice is very limited between two parties. The opinion of the people cannot be expressed properly. b) Cabinet dictatorship: since the party comes to power by an absolute majority, it is difficult to remove it and it can result in the dictatorship of the cabinet.
